President Notes and announcements

The President, who looked a little frazzled with a hectic day behind him, advised that the Club has launched two applications for grants from the Foundation for assistance with providing more facilities at Te Papapa Primary School and for office costs for the Te Whakaora project in Kaitaia. The latter application is strongly supported by PDG Jerry Norman.

The President has referred some proposed amendments for Club Constitutions received from District to Barry Stafford for consideration.

Bill confirmed that the Club's evening at the Dolphin Theatre will raise funds for the District's polio funding drive. Ticket prices will be increased from \$25 per seat to \$30 and there are 113 seats to fill. The date is 8pm Wednesday 13 November 2019. We will be hosting Warkworth Rotary that night.

Following a request from Royal Oak Primary the Club has given a cheque for \$200 to assist them with fundraising for a trip to Tasmania for their successful Quiz team.

One-Minute Spot

Derek Neutze gave details of the roster for this Saturday's Blood Pressure Day taking place at Pack'N'Save, Royal Oak from 10am – 4pm. This is run in conjunction with St Johns

Rod Kestle gave an upbeat report on the hospital at Ambae following his recent visit with Penny to the Island. The hospital is operational, and the gardens are a picture although much needs to be done to clear up the aftermath of the volcanic eruptions. There is ash everywhere. The population was evacuated for 8 months. Rod made the point that for an input of \$30,000 by the Club the end value of the project was \$345,000 and took place over 6 years.

Five-minute speaker



Colin Tea spoke about the first part of his life which took place first in the small Roman town of Gloucester. There he developed his interest in sport and became a choir boy. In his teenage years his family moved to Plymouth. He joined the Royal Engineers and met a young woman to whom he is still married. He got a position in Zambia in Central Africa. In those times there were two international flights to the capital a week. One year later, Ian Smith declared UDI in Southern Rhodesia, which country was on the southern border of Zambia. He experienced the difficulties of petrol rationing which followed. Colin will resume his tales in the future.


