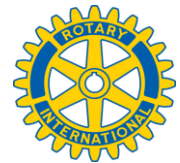

A little about ROMAC:

ROMAC is the acronym for "Rotary Oceania Medical Aid for Children", a combined Australia and New Zealand Multi District Rotary initiative.

In 1998 a Rotarian and a group of Australian surgeons visited Fiji. Since then ROMAC has been providing surgical treatment in hospitals in Australia and New Zealand, for children from developing countries of the Southwest Pacific.

Mission Statement - To provide specialist treatment for children from developing countries, in the form of life saving and dignity restoring surgery, not accessible to them in their home country.
