Guest Speaker



President Robin presented the Strategic Plan for the 2021-2022 Rotary year via a comprehensive power point prepared by Iain and himself.

There were nine different action groupings with details under three headings:

What are we doing, How are we doing it and When are we doing it?

The main focus of the new Rotary year is to get us all on the same track and participating in all activities. There

are no great changes except for the removal of committees, which should help with this focus.

Membership

- The average age in the club is 71 years. We would like to bring the average age down by 3
 years.
- We hope to target 20% membership as women, increasing the number by 6.

Public Image

We need to publicize the work of Rotary to the wider community by

- Developing websites and Facebook pages that appeal to younger audiences
- Writing articles ourselves for the local newspapers

Constitution and Bylaws

Complete the process of revising our Constitution and Bylaws to include new forms of membership.

Fundraising

- Our goal is to raise a minimum of \$10,000 from the bookfair (30 April to the 1st of May 2022 Bill Grayson convenor) to fund community projects. Trevor suggested that we need to think about something less physically taxing in the future, such as a re-vamped Art Fair.
- Peter Mayow will be continuing the Christmas Pudding sales,
- Noel will continue with fines.
- We hope to arrange a fundraiser at the Dolphin Theater, inviting Warkworth and other clubs.
- 70's Club will continue throughout the year.

Rotary Foundation

We will continue to support TRF by raising funds and making donations from the Club Trust. Bruce has offered to collect donations and record anything over \$5.00. Coin boxes will be distributed.

Presentations to update information on End Polio Now and Global Grant changes. Make applications to Foundation District grant funding for qualifying local projects.

- Reading Glasses and Orthodontal programs. (Advocated by Bill Grayson.)
- Sandpit Toy Diggers. District initiative. (Neil and Pat)
- Senior Citizen Project

Identify suitable projects to provide funding and community involvement.

RCOOTH Projects

- Summer Science Foundation identifying 2 suitable candidates from OHS to attend the Science program. August/September 2021
- Organize and fund 4 students from OHS to attend MUNA in May 2022. Rotary cost \$150/student.
- Select and fund two candidates to attend RYLA at \$1,100 per candidate.
- Select, fund and transport 4 candidates for **Kids to Camp** Oct 2021 and June 2022
- Organize teams for **Onehunga Foreshore cleanup** Week of 18th to 25th of September.
- Support Te Whakaora Tangata and the Child Mental Health School Plan in Northland.
