TAKE ACTION: Join Rotary, Get Involved

The **Onehunga One Tree Hill Rotary Club** met tonight at 'EveryBody Eats', an initiative started by Nick Loosley and Auckland Chefs when he saw that there is a need to provide for vulnerable members of the local community and find a way to reduce the waste of food. It has two restaurants in Auckland. Gemmayze Street, a pop-up in St Kevin's Arcade, Karangahape Road, open on Mondays from 6-8pm and ONE Café, 306 Onehunga Mall open 6-8pm Sunday to Thursday. The restaurants are managed by professionals and staffed by volunteers. So far, the restaurants have saved 40 tonnes of food going to waste and served 45,000 meals. EE has 2000 volunteers assisting the programme.

You can assist by eating at the restaurants and paying something, become a volunteer or make a donation. The staff are all local volunteers contributing their time to the social and nutritional needs of those who are less fortunate.

Our members attendance provides financial and moral support for this voluntary service to the Onehunga - One tree Hill Community.

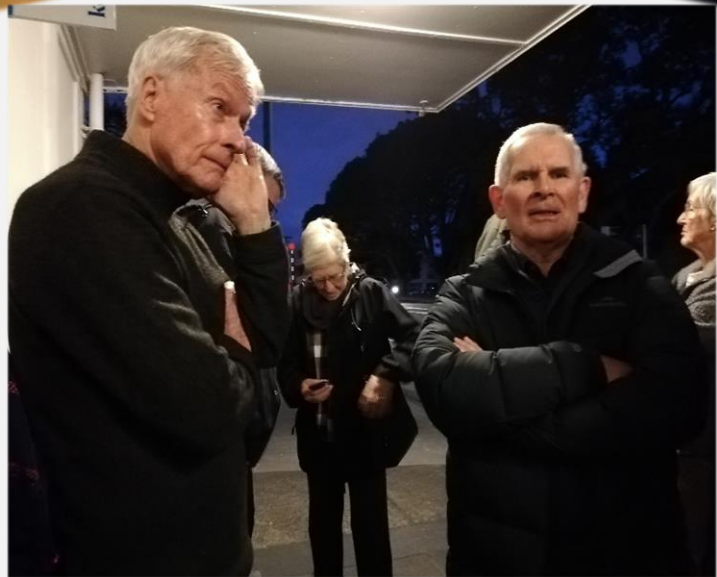

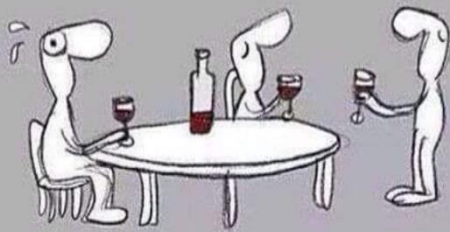
