# **Presidents Announcements**


President Robin welcomed John Mamea- Wilson our Guest Speaker for the night.

Rob Lyons spoke about his family summer batch on Waiheke Island in the 80's and getting sick of the transport requirements decided to sell up.

After an invite to a local Awhitu tennis club gathering they saw a section for sale in Big Bay and decided to buy it. On returning to town people commented that they were not sure about the Manukau, all that mud etc. However Big Bay is actually a beautiful white sandy beach. This was to see them through from the mid-80's to nearly 2000. Rob's wife finally said she had had enough and wanted a house. Rob covered a couple of incidents relating to the choice and relationship with subsequent builder. #### **Guest Speaker: John Mamea-Wilson**

John was introduced by Iain who pointed out that his daughter and John's daughter both went to Onehunga High School and that was how he got to know John and his wife Deanne. Iain outlined John's career, and which led to his current business enterprise where he is the founder and CEO of Sekitech, a technology company, and is chairman of the Pai Te Ora Te Kounga Trust, which focuses on streaming in decile 1 schools in Auckland.

John shared with us the experiences of his journey through life as reflected in the subject of his address, "To Onehunga and Return".

John is now a resident of Onehunga once again after an interesting life that took him to many other places around the world.

John detailed his family links to Onehunga that started in 1960 when his Uncle David Wilson moved here from Samoa. John shared with us his family's ties to Onehunga and to Onehunga High School.

John attended primary school at Cornwall Park School and in standard 4 was lucky enough to be accepted to join his brother at Dilworth School. He was selected as Head Prefect in his 7<sup>th</sup> Form year, the first Pacific Islander to achieve this.

John said that he owed a long running debt of gratitude to Rotary. 30 years ago, as a 6<sup>th</sup> former at Dilworth School, he was fortunate enough to be chosen to attend a 10 day leadership course on the Spirit of New Zealand. He learned so much on that journey and met such great people that even to this day he counts a few of them as some of his best mates. Rotary funded this in its entirety, and he is really glad that some 30 years later I can repay a tiny part of what was afforded to him back then.

He loved sports and excelled at Rugby and Cricket. When he turned 21 he met his future wife. Just weeks before that he had signed a 3-year rugby contract in Wales.

She stayed, he went, he was living the dream. After 2 years he realised that wasn't his dream and he missed his girlfriend. So, he came home. Only to find that the girl he came home for, had applied for, and was offered a job in Dubai. So, he went with her and Dubai became home for 17 years.

For work he veered towards fitness and was soon Managing a Gym.

One day he was approached by an Emirati, an Arab who is from the UAE- and he asked me if he knew how to design and build Gym's. Having zero experience in this particular field, he said of course I do, and the gentleman was the Minister of Defence. Next came the awarding of contracts to build 7 Gym facilities at 7 military bases to service US and Allied forces before their deployment Iraq and Afghanistan. This led to altitude training and the installation of Altitude Chambers which took him to the Ukraine, the authority on altitude study and training protocols. Further research on this took him to Israel who have the most advance and nest funded tech development in the world.

He found he had a passion for health technology and was in awe of the work being done over there. Co-incidentally his mother had a few years earlier been diagnosed with a blood condition which meant that she needed unpleasant blood tests to check her haemoglobin levels.

What he set out to do was work alongside an Israeli company to co design and develop the first regulated Haemoglobin measurement device without having to draw any blood from the person.

To build credibility in NZ he needed an advocate. He approached All Blacks and Warriors head of medical, Dr John Mayhew, to trial and use their device in a clinical setting. By now they had all the necessary local and international approvals and Dr Mayhew is now his business partner in a company called SekiTech, as they are both passionate about using technology to improve health equity in areas most affected.

The future of the company looks bright. They are soon to open New Zealand's first GP less medical centre in South Auckland where their mantra is Managing Wellness instead of Treating illness. The company is connected to an education Trust that provides scholarships to students who would not otherwise be able to attend private schools.

Half the GP's are set to retire in 5 years. Health needs to change, and technology has proved it can ease the impact of this.

John thanked us for the opportunity to speak to us and wished us safe travels home.

Tony Rayner thanked John for sharing his story and commented that the more you stretch yourself the more you succeed. A great example of a work life balance and the importance of family.


