Neil Reid gave us an update on the New Members Interest Group. The planned meeting in March has been postponed until May due to Covid issues. So far, he has received 5 names and is very keen to receive more. Neil asked everyone to get their thinking caps on and let him know names/contacts of anyone considered suitable potential members. Secretary Iain McCrae advised our Club caterer Julia had sadly resigned. However, he had received an email today to say Stacey our original caterer could be available again.....he is following up on this.

Bill Grayson advised that whilst this year's annual Book Fair has been cancelled, he was keen to receive books in anticipation of the Book Fair proceeding either next year or maybe later this year. He mentioned **Bruce Murdoch** has arranged storage space. Bill asked that anyone holding books to contact either him or Bruce and they would arrange collection and storage.

<u>Guest Speaker</u>

Our guest speaker Jeanette Thorne was introduced by **Gwynyth Carr**.

Jeanette who described herself as variously, a Sustainability Advisor, Physiotherapist, Reservation Consultant, Primary School Teacher and a former candidate for the Glen Eden Electorate. (*Ed - clearly a woman of many diverse talents*). She was born in Wairoa, is married to Steve, has 4 children and 4 grandchildren. She has



lived in Royal Oak and One Tree Hill and shortly will live in Mangere Bridge.

Jeanette described her passion for community and school gardens arose from seeing impoverished children in Oranga. She discussed her concerns with others who like her were very concerned and collectively discovered they all wanted community gardens. She became the facilitator and starting with a single tree the group sought free plants and seedlings from various sources.

The first community garden according to Jeanette started fantastically well with lots of enthusiastic volunteers, but unfortunately the onset of Covid 19 has affected progress.

Her community gardens group are currently looking to start a garden in Ferguson Park as well as other parks and are talking with Auckland Council with the aim of having a CG in every council owned park.

Jeanette said the main drivers for CG were reducing poverty plus in her experience people wanted to get 'their hands dirty'.

During question time Jeanette stated they also commenced a Kainga Ora garden 2 years ago and were hoping to get secondary students involved as part of their learning curriculum.

When asked about whether they had experienced any security issues Jeanette said they hadn't really, apart from minor pillaging. She felt the people in the community recognised the benefits were for the local community and tended to leave gardens alone. Most gardens were fenced with a gate.

The question of having roadside berms developed into CG was asked. Jeanette was all in favour, but it depended on the goodwill of Auckland Council, plus there was the

possibility of lead contamination . Native grasses (readily available from retail nurseries) were used as an alternative as they weren't edible, looked beautiful and easily maintained.

Several local projects e.g., restoration of a gully near Quentin Jay's and the Oranga Primary School were suggested to Jeanette as future projects with Rotary assistance.

Jeanette was thanked by **Barry Stafford** for her time and for sharing her passion with us. He commended her for her tenacity and interest in helping others less fortunate and wished her well for future projects.
