

Guest Speaker

Tony introduced Neville Lane to the meeting and noted similarities to his own background with NZ Broadcasting.

Neville had moved from Auckland to Wellington to have an interesting career with the early days of NZ Radio Broadcasting and then a move to Television. He then moved back to Auckland to facilitate the provision of an Asian - Pacific Broadcasting group.

Since retiring he took up house renovating, gardening and grandparenting.

Neville said he wanted to cover three subjects. Senior Net, Scams and Space Cadet.

He was Chairperson of **Senior net** Auckland (Onehunga Branch), where they provided Courses for Computer literacy. Meetings had guest speakers and would bring in technical experts from commercial companies to tutor members.

Onehunga Branch has now disbanded, and Neville has joined Senior Net Pakuranga where they provide casual tutoring.

Scams covered by Neville included the usual scam calls from someone claiming to represent Spark referring to your Internet problem. **Hang up!**

Scams from "VISA". **Hang up**! Emails about car registration payments to an account, **Delete!** Spark technical department about your internet problem. **Hang up**!

Samsung smartphone availability, "confirm address" Delete! Do not engage in any discussion!

Space cadet.

Initially involved in the relay of video recorded, (analogue not digital), Apollo 11 space pictures from the Australian Earth Satellite station, flown by Vulcan bomber to NZ, and broadcast over Television from Auckland.

Neville followed this with an interesting story with details of he Voyage 1 and Voyager 2 space probes. Voyager 1 was launched over 40 years ago. and is still transmitting signals back to earth, after passing by all the planets in our solar system but is still in our galaxy.

Neville supplied many details about space/time communications, among them the time it takes for radio signals to reach Voyager 1- 21hrs and Voyager 2 – 12hrs. By comparison, light travels at the same speed as radio signals and light from the sun reaches earth in 8 minutes.

Deep space is extremely cold 2degrees Kelvin, (-243 degrees C)

The next exciting venture is what the James Webb telescope may discover in deep space.
