Creating a thriving One Tree Hill habitat.





lain lives locally and had noticed a decline of birdlife over past years, which he suspected was from combination of pests and reducing habitat

His idea was to establish a 'halo' area around Parks that mobilized the community to enhance the habitat. "Bring back the songbirds".

His first action was to meet and discuss the concept with the two parks administrators, as their 'buy-in' was and is important.

Cornwall Park Trust Board who manages and operates Cornwall Park and Maungakiekie /One Tree Hill domain is managed by Tūpuna Maunga Authority.

lain formulated a 6 step "business plan" used to socialise to interested parties such as funders. Seed funding was going to be required to provide the free resources to residents in the halo area. A variety of applications were successfully made (and we gratefully acknowledge their support).

- Auckland Council Community grant program 2020
- DOC, via their annual community grants fund 2020
- The "halo" area overlaps 2 local board zones.

Maungakiekie-Tamaki local board in 2020 & 2021 and Albert-Eden local board in 2021.

- The Tūpuna Maunga Authority in 2021.
- •Their mid-long-term goal is to break reliance on grants and obtain commercial sponsorship, but currently with Covid this is not commercially viable.

Organisational structure

A Charitable Trust has been established to run the project.

•The Trust name – reflects 'positive outcome', not narrow focus on just pests • Logo – design incorporates an icon of One Tree Hill (made of birds), green to be 'environmentally friendly.

Press updates are offered out to local community newspapers – primarily the Onehunga Community News.

Attracting members. Letter box flyers allow targeting of "halo" residents.

5 letterbox drops have been undertaken which has resulted in the ~550 current membership base. Register online (website) and then attend a collection day in One Tree Hill to collect requested resources

- Resource supply: monitoring tools & traps
- Envirotools, a Wellington based manufacturer, was selected to supply both our rodent and Possum traps. These traps were selected for their ease of use, quality of manufacturer, value for money, and our support of a New Zealand manufacturer. To date ~400 members have received either a rodent and/or possum trap. Both traps provide a humane kill certified for this.
- In February 2021, a new trap was added to the mix a hanging wasp trap.
- : Native trees are being supplied and they are working with the nursey team at Cornwall Park.

: Bird feeders. These are the top requested item — who doesn't want birds in the garden! The sugar-water bottle supports nectar feeders, such as Tui's, while a hook on the underside of the platform allows you to hang any desired feeder to target a range of other species such as finches. The membership represents around 20% of eligible households in the "halo" area. This is a significant result vs other projects that are pest control focused.



Alan Bannin thanked lain for his informative presentation of the local community project, which will be of benefit to the many members in the area.



Vaccine Passes / Mask Wearing Update

While Vaccine Passes don't have to be used from this morning, individual businesses can still decide to enforce their use.

The Royal Oak Bowls Board met last night and decided NOT to enforce Vaccine Passes meaning that unvaccinated people can now access the club. This decision was based on the high vaccination rates across Auckland.

The Board has also determined that when our members are at the club, effectively we're a private gathering, so mask use inside the building will NO LONGER be required. If you feel safer wearing a mask, then of course you're welcome to continue to do so. Our bar staff WILL still be required to wear masks.

External groups who use the club's facilities WILL still be required to wear masks while moving around inside the building.
