Noel also reminded us that as we now have a return to a catered meeting, we need to be more diligent with apologies to be able to advise the caterer BY Friday night of numbers attending. Neil Reid advised that we had 19 people contacted for next Tuesday's new members meeting, with 9 positive responses and 2 more likely to attend and become members. A great result from Neil's initiative.

<u>5 Minute Spot</u> Bill Grayson brought us an update on the Te Whaka Ora Trust Far North initiative, of which he is, through the Club, a major supporter and unofficial ambassador for their work.

Bill spoke about their success stories and the partnerships they have with other social services in Kaitaia. He mentioned their synergy with Ricky Hortons He Korowai Trust and his purchase of the old Kaitaia Hotel, turning it into a refuge and turning point for men from the district who were ready to change their lives.

(House Rules: no drugs no alcohol) They have a 2-month proving time before reconnecting with their families.

His Trust also bought 50 old state houses from Auckland and transported them to Kaitaia where they were restored and are now used to house families who are part of the family restoration process.

In 2021 Te Whaka Ora worked with 184 families in the FAR North, benefitting up to 644 vulnerable children.






A Touch of Humour!
