70's Club



Noel and Jenny and other family members rushed to Tauranga but Gerrard's prognosis was not good. After the family had gathered and said their last words, Gerrard was allowed to peacefully pass.

Gerrard's funeral was held on 8 July for close family and friends.

Noel conveyed his and Jenny's appreciation of all the messages received from members.


Members stood in silence as a mark of respect and remembrance.
