
Yes, if was a great trip to Tassrikki village to deliver the books. Amazing to see children really happy to see books being delivered.




Te Tai Tokorau Tamariki Project

Lawrie Mead Sailing the Northwest Passage

In the summer of 2021 Lawrie and five friends sailed from Nome in Alaska through the far north of Canada via the Northwest Passage to Nuuk in Greenland.

The journey was made in a 30-metre steel yacht. Lawrie and crew are at present, one of only 286 successful passages which have ever been made through this remote, beautiful and very dangerous stretch of ocean.

Lawrie's remarkable story was related in an understated way. Lawrie relied on his stunning collection of still photos and some videos to help bring us close to his experiences. It was a history and geography lesson as well an entertainment.

Two lifetimes ago while still at school your scribe can remember first hearing about the great search for a new sea route connecting the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans via the Arctic Ocean. Except for a short summer period of about 3months the route is frozen and free of most humans apart from a handful of Inuit.

Lawrie showed how carefully one had to be, navigating through the narrow and changing ice free channels. They sailed with a following wind taking advantage of the current flow. He said that in spite of the challenges it was some of the best sailing conditions he had experienced. At times they had optical illusions and once met a vessel travelling in the opposite direction. That vessel had been iced in from the previous winter. You cannot set off on the journey without enough provisions for a year.

In 1845 the British Admiralty instructed Sir John Franklin to find the Passage and he set off in two vessels, the Erebus and Terror. This expedition got caught in the ice and after two winters and some deaths the remaining crew abandoned their ships. They were attempting to get to the Canadian mainland but vanished. Their fate was not discovered until about ten years later after many unsuccessful attempts.

This little piece of history shows how Lawrie's experience, and that of crew, and his brilliant contemporary photographic record made for an amazing yarn.
