The President reiterated his request for members to provide items for the **New Hope Fellowship Trust Christmas Hamper** programme for needy families.




### Check your 8th December email from

A summary of events. 624 boxes of books, 20,000 books received. Most popular in rough order: Fiction (54% of all books), History, Biography, Non-fiction, Children's, Sport, NZ, Art, Gardening.

Net takings (provisional): \$12,209.50 (up 3% from 2021).

Book buyers were lined up outside for the \$20 Early bird session on the first day. The intermittent rain didn't fail to dampen the public buying spirit as they walked out with arm loads of fiction and our end-of-sale banana-box-book-bargains.
