The 70s Club launched in the 1990's and has raised over \$60,000 in its 30 years of existence. Originally named the 100s Club it was tasked to sell 100 tickets to members, however, it only managed 62 in its first year and so was renamed to the 70s Club. This last year 40x \$120 tickets were sold but the target is to get it back up to 70 sales.

### ANNUAL AWARDS

Each year at Changeover, Paul Harris Fellow awards are presented. It is one of the highest honours a Rotary Club can bestow upon an individual and represents a combination of fellowship and extraordinary service to the community. Recipients are known as Paul Harris Fellows.



The Paul Harris Fellow programme was established to show appreciation to individuals who have contributed \$1,000 to the Annual Programme Fund, PolioPlus or an approved Foundation grant.

Individual Rotary clubs may also, from time to time, award the honour to individuals who meets the high professional and personal standards exemplified by Paul Harris, founder of Rotary International, without the honoured individual having made any monetary contribution. In these cases, the Club contributes the \$1,000.

The Paul Harris Fellow receives a special certificate and gold pin. Alternatively, at the discretion of the club, recipients may receive a gold medallion on a blue and gold ribbon.

# Outgoing President's Speech Quentin Jay, Club President (2022-23)

This year marked the Club's rebound from Covid. We started the year with both me and the past District Governor missing our respective changeovers because of the disease. But nonetheless, we managed to hit the ground running after a long period of Zoom gatherings and cancelled events.

The year began with a call to focus on community needs and future projects. Our area has grown beyond Onehunga and One Tree Hill, so we needed a good think about the diverse communities in other areas in the shadow of Maungakiekie One Tree Hill. Led and inspired by District Governor Matt, we dove into more visible projects out in the community – including community cleanup in Ellerslie, the Community planting project at the OPG and help with the Onehunga Primary School's Fun Run. These projects engaged much of the club but also raised our profile with potential young candidates for the Satellite Club that John Paul is pulling together. Thanks to Peter for spearheading the Community Projects and





for his help in identifying needs in the wider Maungakiekie area.

George is now working on the next shipment.

As with the previous fair, unsold books that would have gone to landfill were diverted to Tonga, thanks to John Tapu with his very big truck. Thanks also to Bill Grayson for his immense organising skills and community spirit that won him a Rotary International Service Above Self award, the third in this club!
