Barry took the opportunity to update us on the **Summer Science Program**. Program material along with Applications have been forwarded to all Secondary Schools. Regards timing we need to receive applications from schools by 25 August with Club final applicant recommendations due at District by 25 September.

Gary Hays confirmed the **Club Movie Night** on **Monday 21 August** at the Lido Theatre, Epsom for a special showing of the recently released movie 'The Miracle Club' featuring Dame Maggie Smith, Kathryn Bates and Laura Linney. He described the film as an Irish Comedy set in the town of Ballygar where the women have a dream to win a pilgrimage to the sacred French town of Lourdes helped by a little benevolent interference from their local priest...

Gary advised we have 140 tickets to sell at \$16 each and is asking members, friends of members and friends of friends to buy tickets to fill the theatre. Proceeds go to the Club Charitable Trust.

Sergeant Noel Carey advised the 'Kids to Camp' program this year has been emailed to Onehunga and Te Papapa Primary schools' seeking nominees. This year's camp will be a Willow Park between 1 October and 5 October. Our aim is to have 4 children attending.

Phil Aish gave us an update on his Hawkes Bay post **Cyclone Gabrielle cleanup**. It appears things have slowed down considerably with Phil having no work assigned to him for 3 days. Accordingly, he repatriated two of his excavators back home.

However there is still a huge amount of remedial work to be done and he mentioned Hick Bros Civil Construction who have been removing silt in a big way. Volunteers have assisted greatly but numbers vary on any given day



making it often difficult to plan. Other issues such as the emotional impact on homeowners is proving very painful as personal items are recovered from the silt.

Phil concluded by saying Rotary Maungakiekie & Stortford Lodge clubs can be very proud of what they have done in the Hawkes Bay. In his words "we have bought hope". He thanked everyone for the support both financial and otherwise during the time he spent in 'the Bay'.

Lloyd Albiston is now kick starting the successful **70's Club fund**raiser for the new Rotary year and circulated a numbers spreadsheet. Tickets are selling fast (27 so far). If you have a favourite number/s between 1 and 77 please let Lloyd know so he can lock you in. Cost remains \$120 per entry.

Cat Levine spoke to us about her 'Think and Be Me' mental health program which has stalled following her recent health problem.

Her back hasn't been responding to Physio treatment to the point where the pain prevented her from walking and standing. Painkillers were of some help but a visit to A&E resulted in her being administered stronger drugs.



Eventually she was admitted to Middlemore Hospital where she underwent emergency surgery for the herniation of a disc in her back. Being the determined Cat we love and admire, she was discharged after 8 days (normally at least a fortnight) and with the aid of a highly decorated 'bling' crutch she is now walking and able to drive.

This all meant her Northland Mental Health program was delayed, but the good news is she is about to recommence school visits. Her original plan was to visit 40 schools in 2024, but this has now been extended out an additional year to 2025 which Cat is very happy about. She mentioned she is in high demand with the Hawkes Bay wanting to adopt her program as well as receiving requests to speak at various Rotary conferences next year.



It was great to see Cat up and about, moving relatively freely and looking ahead with enthusiasm. In her words "I was very stressed for the first 6 months of the year, but my health issues have allowed me to regroup. I am now stronger in myself."

Paul Jenner thanked Cat for the update and informed her "she was doing a brilliant job, to keep it up but not at the expense of yourself."


