guest speaker

DOMINIQUE BONN President, Greenwoods Corner Epsom Business Association

Brian introduced Dominique who is Managing Director of Urban Jungle Group Ltd., an Auckland-based property development and management company. Dominique is also a registered lawyer in both NZ and the UK. He and his family are longstanding commercial landlords in the area. Dominique co-founded the business association with the aim of helping to promote and enhance the Greenwoods Corner business area.

The Association in turn is governed under the Greenwoods Village Epsom Business Association Incorporated.

(An Incorporated Society gives the group its own legal identity, not for profit, can lease, buy, sell property, borrow money, its property is held by the society and not its members, members can change but not be liable for the societies debts, is likely to be operating for a long period - <u>Ref: Incorporated Societies Act 1908</u>).

The executive is made up of seven volunteers who own or are a premises tenant, and who have a desire to promote Greenwoods Corner. The Association is funded by member subscriptions and the Albert-Eden Local Grant.

Six primary purposes (Constitution Rules):

- 1. Assist and guide the development and advancement of commercial interests in the Greenwoods Corner Business Area;
- 2. Foster and promote the welfare of the business community within the Greenwoods Corner Business Area;
- 3. Improve the environment of the Greenwoods Corner Business Area to attract and retain business, drive employment and economic growth;
- 4. Capitalise on the unique assets and amenities of the Greenwoods Corner Business Area and its surrounds;
- 5. Make arrangements with and/or advocate to the Government, local authorities and/or other persons, corporations or associations for the improvement of amenity, streetscapes, utilities, transport, services or other infrastructure, and for lighting, surfacing, security and cleaning to the benefit of the Greenwoods Corner Business Area; and
- 6. Do all things that are, or may be incidental to, or conducive to, the attainment of these purposes.

The Greenwoods Corner Business area as contained in the Constitution, is a 600-meter radius of the intersection of Manukau Road and Golf Road in Greenwoods Corner, Epsom.

The association has grown from an original 17businesses to 42. Although originally intended to be kept small, the intention is to grow their area.





The logo has special meaning and

takes the shape of the intersecting roads (Pah Rd & Manukau Rd) and a tree symbolising the nearby Cornwall Park.

Achievements

Online presence

The development of their online presence occurred during COVID after a media contractor was employed to develop and promote the area. At this point their FB and Instagram sites became a reality. Now, there are ongoing monthly promotions of the various small family-owned businesses including interviews with locals promoting their services. Other initiatives included arranging for the painting of local birds on the Chorus fibre cabinets dotted around the area.

Historic Walks app.

The historical walk app was built by an Auckland University student and the 14-Historical Walks took 2-years to develop with input from the <u>Epsom & Eden District</u> <u>Historical Society</u>.

Greenwoods Canopy

The canopy (which could have been a bit greener) is located at the intersection and shelters pedestrians waiting to cross the junction to during Auckland's intermittent winter showers or scorchingly hot summer days. If you're there, be sure to take time to explore the history app by way of the QR symbol on the wall.

Local AED

An Automated External Defibrillator device (AED) was funded for along with training of the local shop staff and is located at the Physiotherapist on the corner (rather than outside due to the risk of theft).

<u>Events</u>

Spring Festival, 10am – 3pm Saturday, 16th September. A whole family event with live music, entertainment, retail and hospitality specials and an EGGS (Epsom Girls Grammar School) school fundraiser on the day.

Christmas 2023: Christmas stencils will be put up in shop windows and there will be a special treasure hunt, for Children.

Challenges

Security: As with many places in Auckland, security is an issue and the association is working with <u>Nextro</u> (local telecom, network/security, services provider) to develop a plan that will work with available funding.

Parking/ Footpaths/Pedestrian: Shop owners want to keep the parking spaces. There is an ongoing discussion with Auckland Transport who want to remove them. (*Greenwoods Corner is listed by <u>AT as a Tier 2 area</u>: optimising parking, time limited parking, increase parking charges, some parking spaces repurposed to improve travel choices).*

Colin thanked Dominque and added that Greenwoods Corner is indeed a destination, and is very well known, and congratulated him on pulling the 48 businesses together.
